



We will also address the benefit of **minimally invasive laparoscopic and robotic approaches** and the latest **artificial intelligence technologies** applied to medical care.

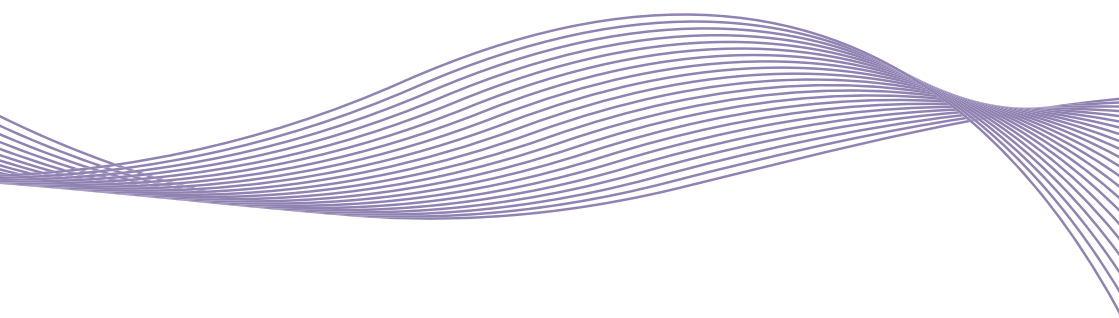

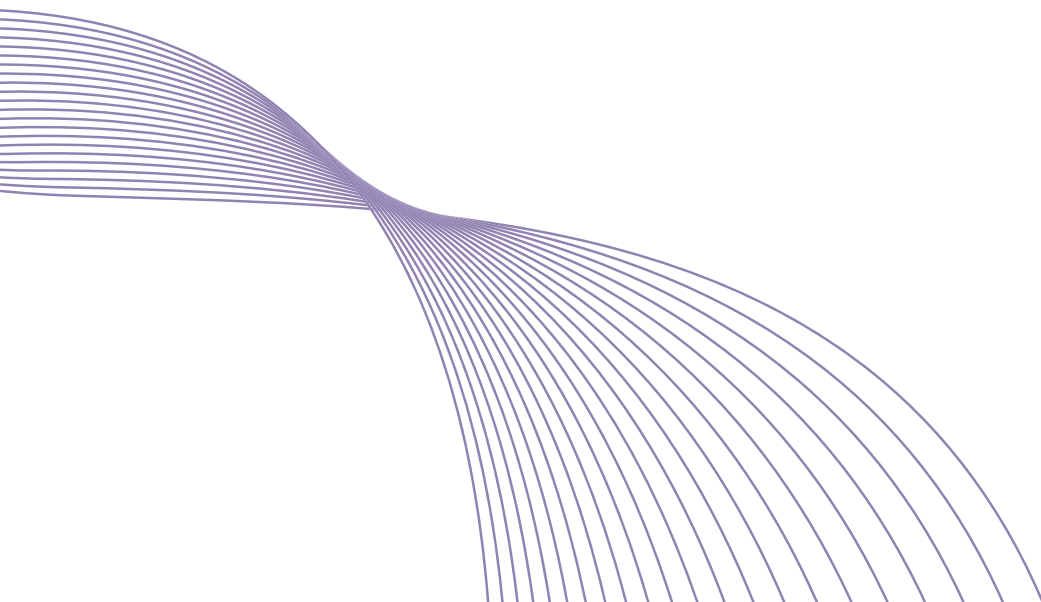


